- gently used clothing and household items can be donated to Salvation Army or Value Village locations;
- extra yarn can be knit or crocheted into squares to help the homeless see blankets4canada.ca;
- old phone books can be dropped off at Consul School (SaskTel's program gives them 10 cents per book).
- used eyeglasses are accepted at many optometrists' offices and eyeglass stores to be donated to third world countries;
- building materials and supplies, new and used, can be taken to the Re-Store in Medicine Hat. They sell them to raise money for Habitat for Humanity.

We can all reduce waste by practicing composting as well. Our fruit and vegetable scraps can easily be turned back into valuable nutrients for the soil. There are many good online articles on this topic. Simply type "how to compost" into an online search engine.

As you can see, there are all kinds of things that can be diverted from the garbage. Hope we have helped make your next bag of trash a little lighter!
