


HELP WANTED

COUNTDOWN TO CONSUL'S 100TH

of Days to the Kick-off: 358

In the year leading up to Consul's Centennial Celebration, as space allows, The Reno Reader will feature trivia, pictures, articles, and other features to get us ready for the big event!

Let's start at the beginning, 1914, with this piece about Consul taken from Our Side of the Hills history book.

"In 1914, when the railway came through, the Village of Consul was surveyed and soon became the center of activity for the area. Garry Brothers built the first building in Consul which was a livery barn. Soon many others followed such as two lumber yards, the Revelstoke lumber was managed by George McMurphy and the Beaver Lumber by J. Engles, the Home Café was run by Mrs. Curtis, the post office was run by Lou Parsons, the barber shop was run by Dave Anderson. There was Herb's Drug Store and many other enterprises followed. Some of these were a hardware store run by J. Ross Clarke, a laundry run by Fred Lee, a bank managed by Mr. McNair, two grain elevators and Oscar Schmidt's dance hall.

"The community progressed over the years from oxen on prairie trails to late model vehicles on all weather roads and from coal oil lamps to Saskatchewan Power.

"Although the village was established in 1914, the actual date of incorporation was not until three years later June 12, 1917. This information was given to us by the archives in Regina. The first overseer, or mayor as we now call this position, was David A. Johnson with Alex Dunbar acting as secretary."



Dave Johnson's new store built in 1916. He sold it to Willis Bartlett in 1923. Willis, along with his sons, David & Jim, ran the store for many years. Willis' grandson, Bruce, sold it to the Southwest Co-op in 1965. Did you know there was once a lunch counter in it & that the south side was a Robinson's Store?

First building in Consul, the livery barn. What was a livery barn? It was a stable where horses and vehicles were kept for hire and where stabling was provided.
