LUCRATIVE FUNDRAISING OPPORTUNITY

Saskatchewan Scrap Tire is arranging a onetime-only free scrap tire cleanup in our Community this summer. Any registered nonprofit corporation volunteerbased service group in the community can apply to the RM to help co-ordinate this Black Gold Rush. The service group would be responsible for either arranging pickup at ratepayers locations and bringing the tires to town to stack at an RM designated location, or co-ordinate dropoff times for ratepayers to bring tires to the designated location. There are two rates depending which option the service group chooses: Passenger/Light Truck = \$0.50/tire; Medium Truck (Semi) = \$1.00/tire; Ag = \$2.25; OTR (Mining) = \$3.50. These rates apply if you arrange for ratepayers to drop off tires, and those rates double if the service group picks the tires up themselves. If more than one service group is interested in this opportunity the RM would like to encourage them to work together. Any interested groups can submit in writing their group name, contact person, and which option they would like to take. Please submit these applications to the RM office by February 25, 2014.
