Dear

As a concerned resident of the Rural Municipality of Reno #51 in southwest Saskatchewan, I ask that the governments halt the transfer of all remaining PFRA pastures and conduct a full review of the Harper Government decision.

I feel I want to be in a situation where government protects endangered landscapes and sustainable agriculture initiatives, like PFRA always did.

I would like to request a full strategic Environmental Assessment of the risks to the natural and human heritage in PFRA pastures in accordance with the Cabinet Directive on the Environmental Assessment of Policy Plan and Program Proposals.

PFRA pastures are the largest and best managed grasslands in Saskatchewan protecting 30 species at risk. I ask that the Government of Canada (PFRA) retain ownership of these pastures to protect their many benefits.

Closing federal ownership and management will be catastrophic for small towns and rural communities, jobs lost, schools closing, and reduced sales for merchants.
