WHEN'S THE TRAIN?

The Canadian Pacific Railway was an enthusiastic user of Mixed Trains to provide freight and passenger service across their prairie rail network. Even during the 1930s Depression years, when premier trans-Canada and regional passenger train schedules were cutback, the little ubiquitous CPR Mixed Trains continued to reliably serve thinly-populated areas.

In 1950, at a time when party-line telephone service and all-weather roads were becoming commonplace, the CPR used two train crew assignments to provide regular passenger/baggage/package/mail service to Consul and southwestern Saskatchewan.

The first train crew operated Shaunavon-Consul on Monday, then ran to Val Marie Tuesday, returning to Consul Wednesday, back to Shaunavon

on Thursday morning, then rounded out their long work week with a trip to Manyberries, AB, on Friday and then back to Shaunavon on Saturday.

A second crew, based out of Lethbridge, AB, headed east to Manyberries on Monday, then Manyberries to Shaunavon on Tuesday, operating west to Manyberries on Wednesday, returning to Lethbridge Thursday morning. On Friday and Saturday, the crew operated a round trip to Manyberries.

The CPR operated a daily-except-Sunday dedicated passenger/mail train between Shaunavon and Moose Jaw, with connections east to Weyburn and south to Rockglen-Coronach -Big Beaver and Mankota branches.

In other words, passengers who solely relied on CPR Mixed Train service to get them in and out of southwestern Saskatchewan could expect to take a two day trip to reach Moose Jaw, and in the case of Tuesday/Wednesday-only service on the Val Marie branch, it was a three day event.


