## MLA REPORT

Agriculture continues to play an essential role for Saskatchewan's diverse economy. All across Saskatchewan harvest is underway, with well over half now complete.

Sixty-five per cent of the crop is now combined, up from 45 per cent last week, which is well ahead of the five-year (2012-2016) average of 40 per cent combined for this time of year. Twenty-two per cent of the crop is swathed or ready to straight-cut.

The lack of rain in the southwest is a great concern as these conditions increase the potential risk of fires. Due to the dry conditions throughout the province, hunters are reminded to be mindful of the risks and take extra precautions, such as:

- Walk whenever possible;
- Carry a fire extinguisher, shovel or other tools in your vehicle;
- Avoid unnecessary vehicle idling; and
- Stick to roads and trails, keeping your vehicle out of tall grass.

Always be aware of current conditions in advance of any hunting trips, as dry conditions may persist in this part of the world and across our province.
