Most of us reading this were born, raised, and educated in Canada. So what does it take to become a Canadian citizen if you come to Canada from another country? In order to apply for Canadian citizenship people must first meet these requirements: be over 18 years of age; provide proof that they know how to speak and write in either English or French; be a permanent resident; be physically present in Canada for 3 years out of the last 5 years before the day they apply. Then they can submit an application with the correct supporting documents and the current fee of \$630 for an adult (\$100 for each minor). If a person is approved, they will then be required to take the Canadian Citizenship Test. The test lasts for 30 minutes and contains 20 multiple choice questions. Applicants for citizenship must answer at least 15 (75%) questions correctly to pass the test.
