## MLA REPORT

Greetings Consul and surrounding communities;

Your Saskatchewan Party government committed to working with municipalities to develop a new, stable revenue sharing formula that works for everyone. Today we have a new, predictable and sustainable formula that will see municipalities receive 4% more funding as part of Saskatchewan's 2019-20 provincial budget.

Saskatchewan's municipal revenue sharing formula is now based on three quarters of one point of the provincial sales tax (PST) revenue collected from the fiscal year two years prior to the current year. This means a consistent source of unconditional provincial revenue for municipalities to invest in local priorities.

The adjusted revenue sharing formula recognizes our current fiscal reality, evolves this key provincial program, and retains the fundamental qualities of predictability, sustainability and transparency. In a balanced 2019-20 provincial budget, Saskatchewan municipalities will see an overall funding increase of more that \$10 million, bringing the total amount to \$251 million next fiscal year.

From 2007-08 to the current fiscal year, Saskatchewan municipalities overall have received more than \$2.6 billion in provincial funding through the revenue sharing program.

In addition to our municipalities, I want to thank all entrepreneurs for their hard work and commitment to growing industry and opportunity here in Saskatchewan.

Modernizing regulations and cutting the red tape is a priority of the Government of Saskatchewan. Unnecessary regulation and red tape costs business, residents and the governments millions of dollars and thousands of hours in lost time every year.

The Canadian Federation of Independent Business (CFIB) recently recognized Saskatchewan for its ongoing leadership in red tape reduction by setting clear targets as well as measuring and reporting the regulatory burden. In 2017-18, regulatory modernization efforts were forecast to achieve \$132.9 million in savings over the next 10 years – across government and Crown corporations.

The Government of Saskatchewan has also introduced the 'Help Cut Red Tape' web page, which is an easy, practical way for entrepreneurs to submit their red tape headaches directly to the government and have them addressed.

Effective red tape reduction also means addressing inter-provincial regulatory irritants. Saskatchewan actively participates as a member of the Regulatory Reconciliation and cooperation Table, as part of the Canada Free Trade Agreement.

Saskatchewan and Ontario are also working with industry to identify opportunities to remove red tape for businesses selling goods or services across Canada.
