World Parkinson's Day is celebrated annually on April 11, Dr. James Parkinson's birthday. The day is dedicated to advocating for people with Parkinson's disease. World Parkinson's Day increases awareness of Parkinson's and is intended to spur new research and treatment initiatives. Parkinson Canada works to educate the public, particularly during the month of April, Parkinson Awareness Month, by hosting fundraising and awareness events and reaching out to Canadians with Parkinson's and the general public in communities across Canada.

Parkinson's disease affects 1 in every 500 people in Canada. Over 100,000 Canadians are living with Parkinson's today and approximately 6,600 new cases of PD are diagnosed each year in Canada (based on annual incidence of 20 new cases per 100,000 people). Most are diagnosed over the age of 60; however, at least 10% of the Parkinson's population develops symptoms before the age of 50. Approximately four million people worldwide are living with the condition.



- Nearly 1 in 2 Canadians is expected to be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime.
- Today, 60% of people diagnosed with cancer will survive 5 years after their diagnosis, compared to 25% in the 1940s thanks to new research discoveries made possible by generous donors like you.
- Canadian Cancer Society is the only national charity that supports Canadians with all cancers in all communities across the country.
- In addition to cancer research and support programs, we advocate for important policy changes and funding for cancer-related issues, such as extended employment insurance benefits for family caregivers.
