DID YOU KNOW?

Exciting finds were made near Consul in archaeological digs this summer! Dr. Emily Bamforth and Dr. Ryan McKellar were part of the dig conducted in Nashlyn Community Pasture in the area known as the Woodpile Coulee Site. The site was discovered in about 1874, likely during the boundary survey. Not until the 1990s was more investigating done there.

The finds lately have included fragments of dinosaur eggshells, just a few millimetres across, and amber which is fossilized tree resin. Specialists search for coal deposits as it is within the coal that they find the amber. New plant fossils were also discovered, as well as the teeth of Ankylosaurus. This is exciting because finding fossils from this species is a vanishingly rare event.

Also rare, according to Dr. Bamforth, is the way in which the layers of earth are aligned at this site. Usually layers are horizontal with the oldest layers the farthest below the surface. At the Woodpile Coulee site, the layers are pushed up and tilted over so they lie in vertical striations. This likely happened during the formation of the Bear Paws in Montana, a volcanic range of mountains. As well, the fossils found here are about 8 million years older than other fossils like Scotty, the T. rex Amazing discoveries abound in our own backyard!

MLA REPORT

Saskatchewan's economy is strong and more people are working in the province than ever before, despite economic headwinds. August marked the 13th consecutive month of job growth in Saskatchewan with 13,000 new jobs year-over-year. Saskatchewan's unemployment rate was the third lowest in the country at 5.1 per cent.

Fast and reliable access to today's digital economy contributes to strong communities. Better wireless service, particularly in rural areas, is a priority of the Government of Saskatchewan. Rural residents require access to fast and reliable services that are on par with urban areas, and SaskTel is working to fill in coverage gaps where they exist.

As part of our government's Wireless Saskatchewan initiative, SaskTel has been able to add 15 new macro towers, providing better coverage in places like busy provincial parks, along major highways, and in areas with little to no cellular coverage. These new macro towers are in addition to the previously announced 103 small cell sites.

Wireless improvements in Cypress Hills Constituency include new towers in Sceptre, Pennant and Prelate, as well as planned improvements for Hazlet.

Since 2010, SaskTel has completed more than 3,200 initiatives to enhance its wireless network that now boasts more than 800 cell sites across the province. SaskTel will continue to evaluate further expansion to better serve Saskatchewan.

Saskatchewan's agriculture sector is an important part of our province's diverse economy. Producers harvested a crop of more than 35 million tonnes in 2018, the sixth consecutive year the provincial harvest has been more than 30 million tonnes. Saskatchewan's total agri-food exports last year were \$13.4 billion, an increase of more than 60 per cent since 2010.

The agricultural industry is the heart and soul of our province and I would like to take this opportunity to wish all producers a safe and successful harvest season.

With harvest underway, more farm machinery and heavy trucks are moving around on Saskatchewan roads. Drivers and farmers are reminded to keep safety a top priority by taking extra precautions when passing slow-moving farm equipment and being respectful of other drivers.

Our highway construction season also continues so, if you're planning to travel, it is a good plan to check the Highway Hotline at Saskatchewan.ca for up-to-date information on construction, emergency road closures, the status of ferries, barges and other road activities.
