Voter turnout at our poll in Consul was strong once again, at roughly 75% of the voters on the list who actually reside in the polling district (some of the names on the list are people who have moved and have presumably never updated their information with Elections Canada). With 225 people casting ballots that breaks down to 19 per hour or roughly one voter every three minutes for the entire twelve-hour period that the poll was open.

election tidbits

- As of October 28, Elections Canada said it had received 21,842 ballots from international electors, the biggest turnout among expats in any federal election. The spike may be connected in part to new rules that make voting easier for Canadians living abroad.
- On Monday, voter turnout was about 66% federally. The average voter turnout for Canada's general elections since 1867 has been 70.5%. The highest voter turnouts were in 1958, 1960, and 1963, when voter turnout was over 79%. The lowest voter turnout on record was in 2008, when voter turnout fell to only 58.8%.
- 4.7 million Canadians voted in advance polls, 29% more than in 2015. More advance polling stations & longer hours attributed to the increase.



