

MLA REPORT

Saskatchewan residents can now look at their laboratory test results and other health records online anywhere, anytime.

MySaskHealthRecord is a secure website that gives eligible Saskatchewan residents quick and easy access to personal health information such as lab results, medical imaging reports and clinical visit history, including hospital admissions. Those who register will have quick and easy access to their personal health information. They will also have the ability to add their own personal information to track and generate reports; set medication and appointment reminders; and upload information from health devices such as wearable activity trackers.

Patients and the health system will see significant benefits from things like fewer unnecessary phone calls and less time taken off work for routine medical appointments. Greater access to information also empowers patients to be more active participants in their care, and that can result in better health outcomes.

MySaskHealthRecord is open to Saskatchewan residents who are 18 years of age and older. To register, residents will need a valid Saskatchewan health card, plus a Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) driver's licence or SGI photo ID card.

All personal health information in MySaskHealthRecord is safe and private. Residents who sign up will only be able to access their accounts through a highly secure, personalized login. To register for a MySaskHealthRecord account, go to www.eHealthSask.ca.

Although there have been delays in the delivery of this year's influenza vaccine, the Ministry of Health has confirmed with Health Canada that Saskatchewan will receive vaccine to support the provincial program start date of October 21. Saskatchewan residents with a valid health card can get their flu shot at public health clinics, local pharmacies, and some physician and Nurse Practitioner offices.

Flu shots are recommended for those at higher risk, including seniors, people with underlying chronic health conditions, children under five, and pregnant women. Seniors often have chronic health conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes, and weaker immune systems, which makes them particularly vulnerable to complications from influenza.

Pharmacists can administer the free flu shot to residents five years and older, during home visits, and in congregate living settings. Children under five and non-Saskatchewan residents can be vaccinated at a public health clinic.

HELIUM PLANT PLANNED FOR CONSUL

Representatives from North American Helium Inc. (NAH), Vance Blydo and Donna Bowles, met with about two dozen members of the public for an information session on October 24 at Consul Hall. Vance outlined general facts about helium then got into specifics about their proposed helium purification plant plans in the Consul area.

Helium is a colourless, odorless, tasteless, non-flammable gas. Coming in as the second lightest element and second smallest molecule, it is non-reactive and does not become radioactive. Helium's unique properties make it essential for vital technologies that affect our lives every day. For example:

- Helium is used in advanced medical imaging equipment like MRIs, providing the super cooling needed for the creation of powerful magnetic fields by these daylogs
- Helium is used in a variety of advanced scientific research applications where super cooling and powerful magnetic fields are required. Applications such as mag-lev trains, superconducting electrical transmission lines, and quantum computing are all examples.
- Helium is used in space exploration and defense applications. Helium has
 unique properties such that it is the only gas that can be used to pressurize the
 liquid fuels that power the rockets driving space exploration, as well as the
 blimps and airships that have other applications within the atmosphere.
- Helium is required for the manufacture of semiconductors, fiber optics, liquid crystal displays and many other applications. If you ever use a computer or an Internet connection, helium was required to make the equipment and components necessary to make these products and systems work.

NAH is the most active driller of helium wells worldwide, with 13 exploration wells to date. Four wells in this area would tie into the proposed Battle Creek helium recovery plant that is planned for south of Consul (5-36-3-27W3). The company is currently finalizing the plant purchase agreement and handling notification and regulatory processes. In the latter half of next year, civil and pipeline construction would be undertaken. Plant delivery and construction is slated for the second quarter of 2021, and if all goes well, it would be on-stream by the third quarter and produce at an estimated capacity of 21 million standard cubic fee per day. During construction and into operation, NAH will source locally for its construction and operator needs. The gas will be trucked to market, one load per day, with a fleet of six to eight trucks put into use to accomplish this.

As helium cannot be stored it has to be hauled to where it can be processed in a timely manner. The nearest liquefaction plants are in Colorado, Kansas and Wyoming where it is likely that the helium will be shipped to be liquefied. As a liquid, helium can be placed in a container whereby it is then marketed globally. In the years ahead, the pinnacle of NAH would be to build a liquefaction plant in southwest Saskatchewan.

The helium in this area is found at depths of 2500 to 2800 metres. NAH targets reservoirs of helium-bearing inert nitrogen carrier gas that does not contain hydrogen sulfide, water or hydrocarbon gas liquids. This makes it easier to purify to the 99.999% level for market sales. The other gases found with the helium are safely vented into the atmosphere.

North American Helium considers itself to be a good corporate citizen. NAH will continue to grow the helium industry in a responsible manner while respecting the environmental and social impacts our projects and facilities may have.
