Consul during COVID-19

Businesses, schools and churches everywhere are having to make adjustments during this pandemic. As of the morning of Tuesday, March 24, these are the changes you will see in Consul. Keep in mind how quickly things are changing so for the most up-to -date information, please contact the business directly.

Pioneer Co-op: Effective immediately, hours will be reduced to 8-5 from Monday to Friday, closed Saturday. Members are asked to leave 2 metres between people. The store is being kept as clean as possible for the safety of members and staff.


Canada Post: Hours that the post office is open to the public have been reduced to 9-12:30 and 1-3:30 to allow for cleaning and preparing for the public. Sanitizing between customers is also being practiced.

Village of Consul: Administrator, Yvonne Leismeister, is in the office regular hours (Tuesday and Wednesday from 9-4) but the door is locked. Doing business by phone or email is encouraged. If someone needs to come in, call to make an appointment and make sure you are well before coming in. Our local library is closed until further notice. A variety of online services, including the province-wide collection of Library2Go e-books and audiobooks, are available to patrons.

Cypress Credit Union: Their doors are closed to the public but they will serve you by phone and email during their regular hours of Monday to Friday from 9-5. They are servicing their membership to the absolute best of their ability during this time.

Consul School: Like all schools across Saskatchewan, our school is closed indefinitely. Premier Scott Moe and Education Minister Gordon Wyant have committed that students will progress to the next grade or class and those who are eligible to graduate will do so. The Ministry of Education is committed to ensuring that supplementary education opportunities will be provided for students. Further information on this will be forthcoming. Education staff are continuing to be employed and paid as they normally would be.



RE: COVID-19 Public Information

Due to the evolving global situation regarding COVID-19, please regularly visit <u>www.Saskatchewan.ca/covid19</u> for the most up to date information.

If the information cannot be found on the website, individuals can email inquiries to <u>COVID19@health.gov.sk.ca</u>.

Self-isolation is a precautionary approach to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 by people that have been in an area of high disease spread or in close contact with a person with COVID-19. Do not attend work, school, daycare, university or cultural events or religious gatherings. You may not have symptoms or may have mild symptoms that can be managed at home, to prevent spreading it to others.

Self-monitoring means watching closely for symptoms in yourself or your dependents including taking temperature twice daily. You do not have restrictions on attending work and school but should avoid crowded spaces and at-risk populations meaning those with weakened immune systems or individuals 65 years of age and older. At first sign of symptoms, you should self-isolate.

All residents can help prevent the spread of COVID-19. As a respiratory illness, the best method to protect yourself against COVID-19 is to practice everyday preventive actions, including: wash your hands frequently, sneeze or cough into a tissue or your sleeve, practice social distancing and stay home if you are sick.

If you are a snowbird or have family or friends that are snowbirds, please self-isolate for 14 days upon return to Canada.
