REPORT FROM POLL 41

By now you have heard the news that voters in Saskatchewan returned Scott Moe and the Saskatchewan Party to lead government in our province for another term. After all the votes were counted, the Sask. Party won 48 of the seats and the New Democratic Party won the other 13.

At our local poll in Consul there were 187 people who cast ballots on October 26th. (18 additional people voted at advance polls or by mail and their ballots would have been counted elsewhere.) The results looked like this:

There were 314 names on the Voters List for our poll. With 205 people voting that represents a 65.3% voter turnout. Provincially the turnout was 52.9%.

As we checked IDs that day, we noticed many that had their mailing address on their driver's licence. This piece of ID should show your <u>physical address</u> (street address or land location). It then becomes the only piece of ID you need to show when you vote. Furthermore, according to police, a physical address on a driver's licence will assist emergency services to more efficiently locate an 'at home' emergency which may result in saving a life. An address update can be done at an SGI office, online through MySGI, or by calling 1-844-TLK-2SGI (1-844-855-2744) and having your Customer Number from your driver's licence ready.
