

The 2020 Summer Olympics, officially the Games of the XXXII Olympiad and also known as Tokyo 2020, is an upcoming international multi-sport event scheduled to be held from July 23 to August 8, 2021 in Tokyo, Japan. Originally scheduled to take place from July 24 to August 9, 2020, the event was postponed in March 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite being rescheduled for 2021, the event retains the *Tokyo 2020* name for marketing and branding purposes. This is the first time that the Olympic Games have been postponed and rescheduled, rather than cancelled. The Summer Paralympics will be held between August 24 and September 5, 2021.

The Olympics will feature 33 sports at 339 events across 42 venues. The Paralympics will feature 22 sports at 539 events across 21 venues. Most events will be in the Greater Tokyo area. Some football games and the marathon are in Sapporo in Hokkaido.

The 2020 Games will see the introduction of new competitions including 3x3 basket-ball, freestyle BMX, and madison cycling, as well as further mixed events. Under new IOC policies, which allow the host organizing committee to add new sports to the Olympic program to augment the permanent core events, these Games will see karate, sport climbing, surfing, and skateboarding make their Olympic debuts, as well as the return of baseball and softball for the first time since 2008.

Team Canada is comprised of 380 athletes competing in 30 sports. Canada's Olympic team will contest all sports on the Olympic program except handball, modern pentathlon and surfing.

Hailing from Saskatchewan are three of the Team Canada roster - Cole Pratt, Jennifer Gilbert and Rylan Wiens. Cole is 18 and was born in Regina. He will be competing in swimming in the 100-meter backstroke event. Jennifer is a softball player, originally from Saskatoon, now living in Texas. She is 29 years old and has been part of the national team program since 2009. Rylan is 19 and lives in Saskatoon. His event is 10-meter platform diving.

Will spectators be allowed at these Olympics? An article dated July 1, 2021 on cbc.ca says that Japan's Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga was still uncertain whether fans can be allowed at the Tokyo Olympics because of growing concern about rising COVID-19 cases only three weeks before the Games. Organizers last week decided to allow up to 10,000 spectators or 50 per cent of venue capacity if emergency measures are lifted before the Games. Following criticisms and concerns raised by experts and the public, government officials later said they are open to having no fans if the infections worsen.
